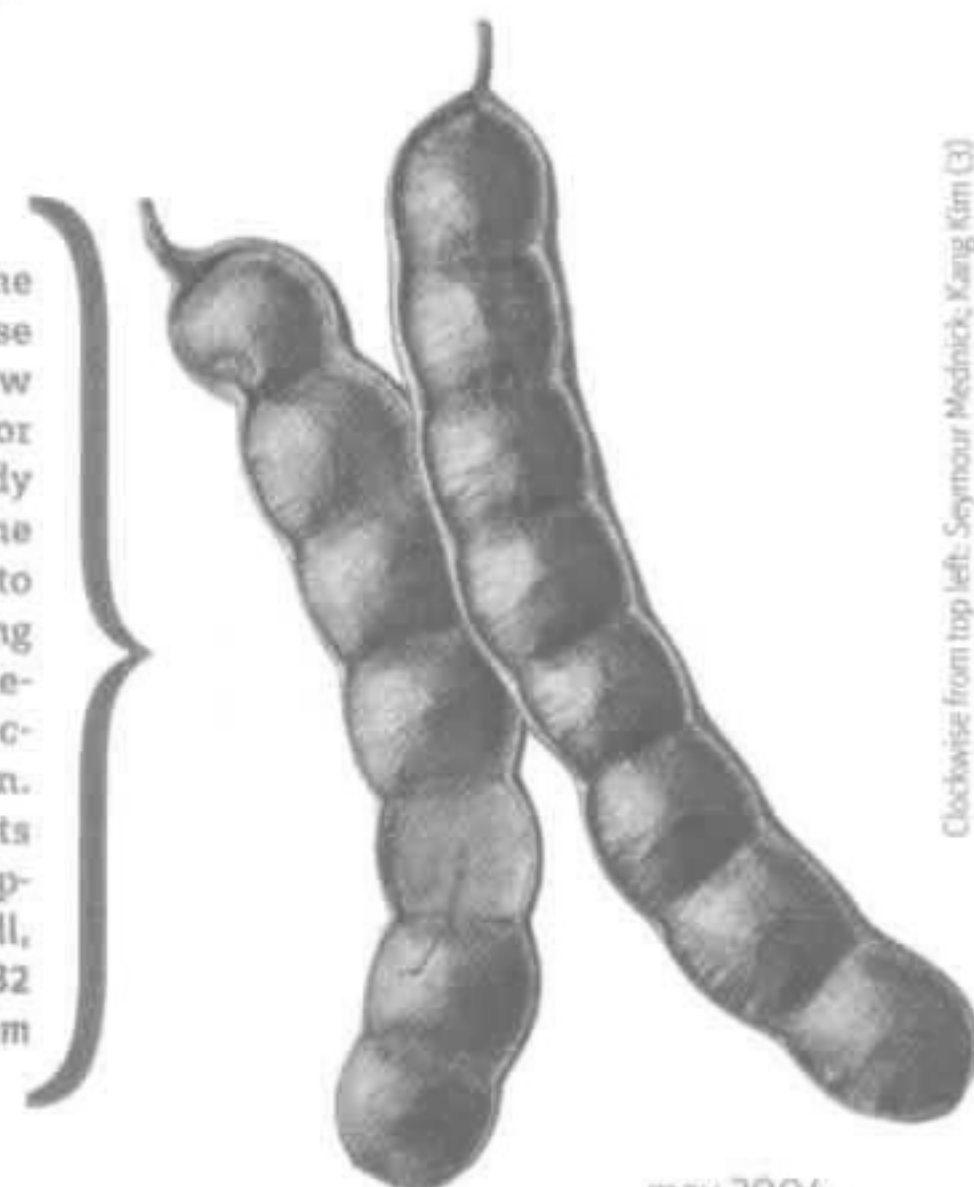


Pop and Circumstance
